## “The Social, Economic, and Political Status of California’s Immigrants” Eighth Annual University of California International Migration Conference

### Call for Papers

For the past decade, state and local policies in California have gone against the national trends. Instead, our state has engaged in a set of policies more focused on integrating immigrants into California’s social, economic and political fabric. We are calling for papers that explore the impacts of these policies. What is the current status of immigrants in the state? How have public policies helped (or not) to support immigrants’ integration across multiple domains? Given what has happened on the state and local levels, how do we imagine that changes in policy at the federal level might affect California’s immigrant communities? We invite researchers to submit empirical and theoretical work exploring these questions. We also invite prospective analyses of the future of state and national immigration policy under a Trump administration.
